RESOLUTION 2026 - 04

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE BETTER UTILIZING INVESTMENTS TO LEVERAGE DEVELOPMENT (BUILD) GRANT PROGRAM.

WHEREAS the City of Harrisburg, SD wishes to apply for consideration of award for the BUILD Grant Program for the reconstruction of 273rd/Willow Street Phase II Project; and

WHEREAS the City of Harrisburg completed and adopted the 273rd/Willow Street Corridor Study; and

WHEREAS the Study recommended improvements to 273rd/Willow Street from Lake Alvin, east of Highway 11, west to Heritage Parkway, which is west of I-29.

WHEREAS the City of Harrisburg hereby authorizes the BUILD Grant application for reconstruction of 273rd/Willow Street Phase II, from the east property line of the Harrisburg High School property west to a quarter mile west of SD Highway 115, in line with the Study recommendations, and intends to authorize the required matching funds if necessary in the terms of any subsequent grant award.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) accepts the 273rd/Willow Street Phase II BUILD Grant application from the City of Harrisburg, SD.
